**Thank you for your support of the United Church of Christ's International Disaster Efforts. Because of you, we have helped thousands in the midst of devastation and loss. We turn to you again as we assist with relief efforts in Haiti.**

"The island of Haiti suffered major damages and loss of life," said the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, associate general minister, Wider Church Ministries and Operations. "We are issuing an appeal through the Global H.O.P.E. team to assist with short-term and long-term recovery needs." A massive 7.2 earthquake has killed more than 1,500 people to-date. Search and rescue efforts are expected to be hampered by Tropical Depression Grace, which came ashore on Monday, August 16.

"The funds raised will support immediate relief efforts assisting survivors as well as to have resources for long-term rebuild opportunities," said Joshua Baird, team leader of Global H.O.P.E. Baird was in touch with the partner networks and said that the ACT Alliance reports that more than 60-percent of the people of Haiti have been impacted by the disaster. Both the ACT Alliance and Church World Service have spoken about "significant infrastructure challenges," with road closures due to civil unrest compounded by earthquake damage.

"We hold our partners and Haitian siblings in our thoughts and prayers through this time of suffering."

## BoV Time Capsule Input Wanted...

### Notes from you about “My thoughts, concerns, advice, hopes, and prayers”



The 2020-2021 renovation time capsule box will be sealed for Homecoming Sunday, September 12th. It is built from the east lawn maple tree brought down in March 2020 in preparation for construction of the new fellowship stairs from the Sanctuary to Hardy Hall. The box will be opened in April 2043 for the 300th anniversary of the ordination of the Reverend Daniel Emerson, the church's first minister.

The time capsule box will be displayed inside the church (as a locked box) rather than buried. **A variety of items will be placed inside the box, including pre-printed cards/paper for each of us to fill out, sharing our thoughts, concerns, advice, hopes, and prayers at this 2021 moment in time.** We would love to get note cards to put inside the time capsule from as many individuals as possible (children included!) Tell your 2043-self and others (some not yet born) all about you, your community, and the world as you see it.

We sincerely hope everyone will partake in this activity so in 2043, parishioners at that time (including some of us, our children, and grandchildren) can get a wonderful sense of how we were feeling at this time. All input will remain unread – the time capsule team recognizes and respects that these documented thoughts are for the eyes of our future selves, as well as for parishioners unknown at this time. Things are changing at lightning speed, so it's quite certain that in 2043 things will be very different and those reading the cards will very much enjoy hearing about our thoughts today!

Between now and Homecoming Sunday (ideally no later than September 10th) – **Print and fill out your form (see below)**

1. **Bring it** to a Sunday service in a sealed envelope marked "Time Capsule" on the outside. You can give it to a Deacon or Rev. Tanya.
