



During this time of ongoing discernment, there is opportunity to anticipate and observe how God's desires will be unfolded; let's not quit our Advent practices just because the season is behind us. But let's also notice where Christ's tireless message of abundance and glimpses of new life are already illuminating our community. For example, witness the sacrificial generosity of so many who have already demonstrated faith and confidence in our church's current ministry, as well as our future potential, through their support of the capital campaign: that is a sign of the Light of the World in our midst! Consider how our ongoing staff transitions are helping us to acknowledge how richly God has blessed us for many years—and how God is continuing to bless us with fresh, exciting new leaders with gifts to equip us for what's next! And, don't miss the ways our community is growing in a deepened fellowship, connecting with one another in new and meaningful ways as we explore the Holy Habits.

In the New Year, that will become our focus in worship for a while. Beginning in January, we will address the Holy Habit of *Fellowship*. In Greek the word is *koinonia*, and it is used in the New Testament specifically to describe the relationship between Christian believers in community. It's a deeper level of connection than an informal social gathering; it's a partnership, com-

munion, a commitment to share life in meaningful ways by one's participation in that community. Among other things, we'll be thinking about trust, and mutuality, and the strength of vulnerability that is learned by actively participating in Christian *koinonia*-fellowship.

As I've said before, God has been busy with our community in some awe-inspiring ways. I pray that we'll continue to be open to that divine activity, and I look forward to the new Light and Life that will dawn on us as we continue journeying deeper in faith in 2020!


