

Dear Friends,

What is your personal experience of Jesus? Some people say he's their best friend: they talk to him about everything, though he's obviously not an embodied presence whose words another person in the room would hear equally audibly. Others experience him as more two-dimensional: an historical character in an ancient text—someone with a gripping story offering guidance and grounding for how to be a good human. Some believe that saying, "I believe in Jesus" are somehow essential magic words to spare them from hell in the afterlife. Plenty of people don't know exactly *what* to make of him—but there's something compelling, lively, immediate-yet-eternal, about him that goes beyond the millennia-old stories that first pique our interest.

I'm going to guess that, at a minimum for those of us connected to Christ's Church, Jesus is someone whose life inspires us. Gives us hope — for our own life, if not for all of humanity. Challenges or encourages us to do better, to be better...to prioritize our relationship with God, to live from the wellspring of love instead of feasting on the font of fear. And yet, like Jesus' first disciples (those who actually *did* have an embodied presence eating and talking

with them), if we're serious about doing what disciples truly want to do (e.g., striving to think and act and relate with God in the same way he did, because we recognize the power and truth of such a life), then we're also painfully aware of how often we miss the mark.

I've heard athletes talk about the power and importance of visualizing a successful performance to enhance their performance during the actual event. Albert Einstein famously suggested that imagination is more important than knowledge; knowledge is limited, whereas imagination encompasses the entire world—indeed, can usher us into different worlds. Strangely, it seems to me, the role and significance of imagination sometimes gets minimized, even disparaged, in our culture. We put such a premium on "facts, figures, and visible proof"—particularly in the realm of faith, and our relationship with God, and Jesus.

Although I've had an (evolving) relationship with Jesus for my entire life, I'm endlessly learning the importance of engaging my imagination when I approach the stories about him, and his teachings. And that's why our Lenten series is proving so powerful for me. For you too, I hope! Each week, we're "Entering the Passion of Jesus", trying to imagine ourselves in the scene described, while also being attentive to the connections between "then" and now.

Sometimes, we can become numb to Jesus' courage (courage he promised we too will have, by the way, when we accept the power of his Holy Spirit—which may, or may not, also cause you to call on your imagination) because we've heard the stories so often. As we journey through this Lenten month where we straighten our focus on following Jesus: notice the ways Jesus fearlessly risks reputation; risks defiant challenge by those bent on deception; risks righteous anger, rejection, the loss of friends; and confronts the temptation to forsake the righteous behavior for the sake of something less painful or self-sacrificing. Then, imagining yourself in the scene with Jesus, consider how you—Jesus' trainee/ disciple—are being summoned to similar risks today. Christ's Passion narrative may be thousands of years old, but it's still being told ("same song, new verse") all these years later.

Having identified more closely with Jesus and his Passion this Lent – having deepened our personal connection with him through the gift of imagination – we will celebrate with greater joy and hope on the last Sunday of March (Easter Sunday) . . . because we will have experienced more personally the hope and truth of Resurrection! Hallelujah!

Bekah lives in Northampton, Massachusetts, where she enjoys playing Dungeons and Dragons, sampling many kinds of loose-leaf tea, and entertaining her tiny gray cat, Jasmine.

Beanie instructions below.

* * * * * * *

Knitted Baker Street Beanie Instructions:

Materials:

Needles: #8 circular needles and #8 double point needles

Yarn: 200-250 yards of any yarn from Knots of Love's list of yarns

Stitch marker Tapestry needle



Instructions:

Cast 80 stitches onto #8 circular needles. Being careful not to twist, form into ring, place stitch marker

Brim: Work *K1, P1 for approximately one inch.

Pattern: Rnd 1: *Purl around Rnd 2: *K1. P1 around

Repeat rnds 1 and 2 until piece measures 6".

Crown Shaping: Change to dpn when needed.

Rnd 1: Purl 6, P2 tog around

Rnd 2: K1, P1 around

Rnd 3: Purl 5, P2 tog around

Rnd 4: K1, P1 around

Rnd 5: Purl 4, P2 tog around

Rnd 6: K1, P1 around

Rnd 7: Purl 3, P2 tog around

Rnd 8: K1, P1 around

Rnd 9: Purl 2, K2 tog around

Rnd 10: K1, P1 around

Rnd 11: Purl 1, P2 tog around

Rnd 12: K2 tog around

Finishing: Leaving 12" tail, cut yarn and thread through a tapestry needle. Transfer stitches from dpn to yarn. Cinch tightly, tie off, and weave in all ends.
