Dear Friends,

Tectonic shifts have been manifesting across the world at multiple levels for years now: ecological, sociological, political, technological, even theological and ethical. We've all felt them. And, many of us are noticing the ways these massive changes are messing with understandings and bonds we once thought were solid. Relationships, institutions, and social dynamics we once took for granted are no longer functioning the way they “always used to.” It's a profoundly exciting—and exhausting, and in some ways terrifying—time to be human!

As Christians, these dynamics should not surprise us. After all, they're at the heart of our faith story: there is death, and resurrection. God is endlessly at work doing new things—even with the grave messes (both malicious and unwitting) human beings make. If, like I, you find yourself periodically despairing, I encourage you to join me in trying to make a regular exercise of naming where you see God tenaciously at work, bringing unimagined new shoots of creation in places fraught with death, devastation, and/or senseless destruction.

There are two books I commend to you to read (or listen to; they're both available as audiobooks) at some point across this summer. The first is Brian MacLaren's *Life After Doom: Wisdom and Courage for a World Falling Apart* (New York: St. Martin's Essentials, 2024). And the second was just published in April, by Aziz Abu Sarah and Maoz Inon called *The Future Is Peace* (New York: Crown, 2026). Both books offer challenge and hope, sober reality and sacred aspiration. And in different ways, they invite us to consider our personal role, meaning-making, and relationships amidst all that's unfolding around us, with us, and through us collectively. I hope to schedule some time to discuss them in the fall, so watch this space for further details.

Among the more commonplace (but still dramatic!) changes being felt by some of our community this month are those we mark every year at this time. As the month of May unfolds, it will offer up its usual opportunities to celebrate and/or honor significant people in our lives, and as usual, Sundays in May will be full of celebratory moments! Mother's Day is on May 10th. Children's Sunday (during which The Flock will lead us in worship) will be celebrated on May 17th, followed by a pot-luck luncheon that will hopefully be able to spill out onto the Squires Patio! May 24th is Pentecost, and we will welcome our own John Pfeifer as guest lay preacher that Sunday. And, on May 31st, we'll have a moment of celebration and prayer of blessing for all of our graduates—so, if you'd like your graduate's information to be shared, please email that information (school, degree, future plans) to admin@hollischurch.org by May 24th so that it can be included in the bulletin!

Congratulations and blessings to all those who will be celebrating!

Friends, as new life continues to burgeon across our landscape, receive it as ongoing testimony to the fact that God's work never lets up; what looks like a mess in one moment will, in time, bear evidence of God's stunning ability to keep producing beautiful life even out of ash heaps. Be sure to check next month's summer *Chimes* edition for some fun summer programs.

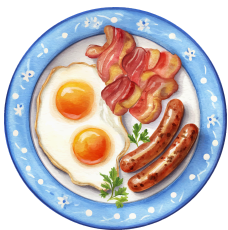
A special thank you to all the volunteers who have shared their time with the children in the Flock or the nursery. You've helped make these programs run smoothly—and be a lot of fun!

Adults and those entering grade 7/up are welcome to volunteer. Sign up for as many days/hours as their schedule allows and consider these roles:

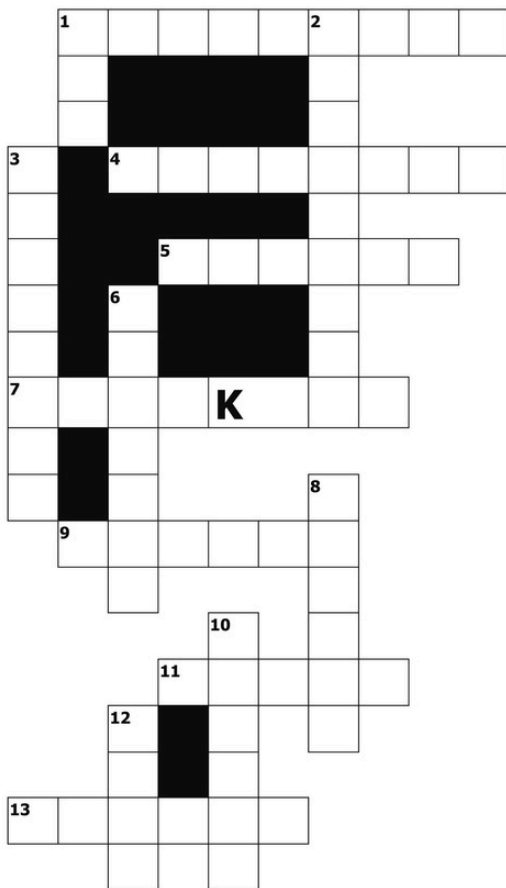
- Group leader

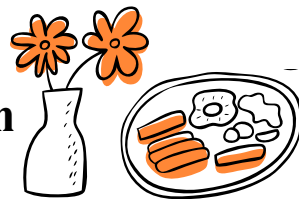




Council to Host March Fellowship
