We hope the congregation has enjoyed the events held so far. As a recap, in **March** there were five **Lenten Loaves and Lessons** held where we shared food, fellowship, learning, and thoughtful discussion, and in **April** Rev. Bob led three "sold out" **Brush & Biscotti** paint events (April 16 class pictured).

May promises awe-inspiring entertainment as Rev. Bob treats the community to a full-length magic show on Saturday, May 13 at 10:30am on the Squires Community Patio (to be held in the Meetinghouse in case of rain). This will take place simultaneous with the church-hosted Community Yard and Bake sale, Library Book Sale, and Colonial Garden Club Plant Sale. You've seen a

small sample of Rev. Bob's magic on Sunday mornings during "A Message for all Ages". Come enjoy a full show of his mastery of magic (he was a professional stage magician performing on national TV) and be sure to invite friends and family!

As the program year winds down, be sure to save a couple of dates in early June:

- Saturday, June 3 (time 2:00pm; rain date June 10) Hike at Beaver Brook followed by a bonfire discussion. We will lead two hiking groups, one for relaxed hikers with a shorter route and a longer one for the more energetic among us. The shorter route will not be silent but encourage some quietness to "be in the moment" with nature. The longer hike will have periods of silence but also periods during the hike when discussion will be encouraged.
- Sunday, June 4 after worship TENTATIVE "And the Rest is History" presentation on Henry Opukahaia presented by Cindy Ryherd. Henry Opukahaia is the man credited with starting Hawaii's conversion to Christianity, and he has a very important tie to the Congregational Church of Hollis.

During the Sabbatical period, reflect on where we are and how far we've come over the last few unusual years. Look for an email in the coming weeks to complete a 3-question survey (anonymously or named as you prefer) providing your input on the past, present, and future. We encourage everybody to contemplate how you would like to go forward in the years to come and complete the survey. 
