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

Dear Friends,

There are at least 79 instances in the Old and New Testaments where we’re exhorted to “give thanks to God” (or to the Lord). The verse that’s quoted at the top—the one that tells us to give thanks, because God’s steadfast love endures forever—is repeated verbatim at least 11 times! “Give thanks” and “do not be afraid” are, I think, the two most-repeated refrains in the Bible.



I, for one, am deeply grateful this month that we’ve voted as a congregation to test our faith. And I know I’m not alone. For some, a “test of faith” suggests hardship and pain, a moment when one might question whether God is actually with them. But as many of our ancestors in faith discovered, the most life-giving decision they ever made was to test their faith: to boldly risk giving up what was comfortable for the sake of a future with unknown blessings—because it proved their confidence in God’s provision, and that confidence was rewarded in ways that far exceeded their sacrifice.

The test of faith we’re embracing represents an exciting challenge, and an incredible opportunity to experience first-hand the ways God and people can work together to give birth to transformational new beginnings. I’m confident that if everyone participates in good faith in whatever way they’re able, we will grow as a community. Our mutual appreciation and affection for one another will grow. Our understanding of God’s abundance, expressed through the variety of our contributions, will grow. Our spirits will grow as we all work together, which will enhance the collective Body we represent. And all these effects will spill over into the community around us, coloring and helping to transform the world beyond our walls and membership.

Across the unfolding months ahead, every member and friend of this community will be asked to participate in the activities that will help move us toward our goal. *(continued on page 7)*

BOV UPDATE

October 21 Vote Follow Up: Capital Campaign Launch Approved!

The BoV Team is pleased that there was such strong support for launching the Capital Campaign that will raise funds for our renovation project. Under the direction of Rev. William 'Bill' VanderWyden of VanderWyden Capital Development Consultants, the campaign will begin in mid-November. The campaign will be in hiatus over Advent but will resume in earnest after the New Year running to mid-April 2019.

BoV and the capital campaign team will host coffee hours, meetings, house gatherings, and similar events to review plans and discuss how we can raise money. Our hope is that these events will increase enthusiasm for the project with pledges of support to match.

We also hope that people will use these events to begin to imagine how our new space can best be put to use to give life to the four pillars of our strategic plan: welcome, worship, learn, and serve. Remember, a vote to approve the project and authorize the expenditure of funds for construction will occur once we understand the likely outcome of our capital campaign. If you're interested in being part of this process, please email BoV@hollischurch.org.

At the same time as the Capital Campaign gets underway, BoV will further its work on the details of the plan, meet with town officials and church committees, and will continue to communicate with the congregation. We are always happy to hear from you at any point in the process.
