(We've had to squeeze more chairs up into the chancel area to accommodate nearly 20 singers some weeks—an enviable challenge to face!) And, we are incredibly blessed as a small-town church in 2025 to have some 20+ families actively involved in The Flock (children's ministries).

Our Caring Cooks and Caring Connection teams are reaching out to expanding numbers of folks in need of a gesture of care: a home-cooked meal, a phone call or card during a difficult time, and also periodically provides meals for our Adult Faith Formation's "Loaves & Lessons." The Fellowship & Hospitality Ministry Team deliciously nurtures many of our communal gatherings, and our Knitting Ministry Team creates beautiful stitched expressions of loving care.

All of these ministries (and several others I didn't mention!) are able to flourish and put more joy into the world, because you support them with your generosity. As our Stewardship theme suggests, dreaming God's dream means that no gift is too small, nor any dream too large. When we commit ourselves to participating, literally investing ourselves in the change we want to see in the world, then amazing things start to happen! I hope that, if you haven't already, you'll make a pledge to financially and personally support the great things God is doing with us and through us here for 2026!

I am also deeply grateful for the hard work the **Bylaws Task Force** is doing, trying to articulate the ways our life as a covenant community in Christ is evolving.

We need your help with some of it! As a Congregational church, we need the congregation's input regarding what membership means to folks today—especially as social expectations and understandings of duty, accountability, and commitment to social institutions have changed with time. Please, if you're able, plan to attend one of the focus group discussions about this on Nov. 2nd or 9th (we hope to keep them to no more than an hour) in Emerson Chapel.



There are a **few other events** I hope you'll consider supporting, as we continue to visualize and embody God's dream for us here:

- Nov. 2: The second (bi-ennial?) ChariTea will take place at 3 p.m. in Hardy Hall: lovely music, great fellowship, lots of fabulous baked goodies...bring a friend and some family members! (And, if you come to the focus group before that, the good news is you'll get an extra hour of sleep the night before, so you'll be all rested up for that busy day!)
- Nov. 16: Tivvi Paré (Director of Horton Center) will come and talk about camp opportunities for families and kids—and after church, we'll welcome everyone who can help with our annual Thanksgiving Food Box packing at Brookdale Farms... many hands make light work!
- Nov. 23: as part of Thanksgiving and Commitment Sunday, we'll be welcoming some new members and celebrating a baptism—I hope you can be there!
- Nov. 30: the First Sunday of Advent! This year, we will be pondering the question, "What Child IS This?" More on that to follow...

Friends, as the days get colder and shorter, may the light and warmth of Christ abide with you, and may your generosity fill you with joy!


Knitting Ministry

Annual Giving Tree Program

The Mission & Action Board sponsors the Christmas Giving Tree* for Nashua Children's Home and Marguerite's Place.



The Christmas tree will be in Hardy Hall on Sunday, November 23. If you are unavailable to attend church that date, please call or email Karen Marino and she will deliver the tags. She can be reached at 603-475.3073, or kmarino360@gmail.com.

How It Works:

- 1. Choose one or more tags from the tree depending on how many children you wish to sponsor.
- 2. There are TWO tags on each string. Pull the second tag off the string, write your name and telephone number on it, and put it in the basket provided.
- 3. Keep the top tag. It has the information about the gift recipient.
- 4. Go shopping! Use the information and suggestions on the tag as a guide. It is not necessary to purchase every item listed on the tag. Many items are available on Amazon. In order to make all children feel equally loved and important, (kids know how to count!), we ask that everyone have 6 to 8 gifts for each child to open.
- 5. Please wrap gifts individually with the child's code number on each package, from: Santa.
- 6. Place all gifts in a large plastic bag. Attach the tag to the bag with the gifts you purchased checked off. Any other items which are not on the tag, please list.
- 7. Please return the bags to church as soon as you have them ready to go. The deadline is Sunday, December 14th to give us time to deliver them.
- 8. Monetary donations toward fulfilling "Christmas wishes" are also gratefully accepted. Checks should be payable to the Congregational Church of Hollis with Giving Tree on the memo line. Monetary donations are needed by December 1st to allow time for M&A to shop to fulfill wishes.

Ministry of Service: Historic Gravestone Cleaning

What Drew Her to This Mission

Anita's journey began during Wreaths Across Hollis, when volunteers gathered to honor Revolutionary War patriots by placing wreaths at their graves. But many of the headstones were so weathered and dirty that names couldn't be read. "We wanted to honor them," Anita recalls, "but we didn't know who we were standing in front of."That moment stirred something in her heart. With a fellow DAR member, she began identifying the patriots buried in the church cemetery and marking each grave with a small American flag. From there, a deeper mission took root: to clean and preserve these sacred stones so that no name would be lost to time. Her first stone was that of our own first minister, Deacon Emerson. It was in severe condition—weathered and fragile from centuries of exposure. She and a fellow DAR member felt called to honor its legacy. They contacted a descendant and reached out to multiple restoration companies, hoping to repair the damage. But after careful research and consultation, they learned that attempting a full restoration could further compromise the stone's integrity. Instead, they chose the gentler path: to clean and preserve it, safeguarding its history without risking harm.

Anita did what she could: with permission, she gently cleaned the stone using all-natural, biodegradable supplies. That simple act of care became the beginning of a much larger mission.

What She Does

Anita now coordinates volunteers to clean gravestones in the cemetery. She teaches others how to do it safely, records each cleaned stone, and helps place flags on the graves of Revolutionary War patriots. So far, over 50 stones have been lovingly restored in the church cemetery alone—bringing dignity and visibility back to those who shaped our town's history.

Why It Matters

"It is heartbreaking not to be able to read the headstones and know who we are honoring," Anita shares. "Cleaning the stones brought their names back. It's a way of saying, 'You are not forgotten." There's an old saying: 'If you speak their name, their memory lives on.' In restoring these markers, we do more than preserve stone—we preserve identity, dignity, and connection. Some headstones bear poems or verses that hint at personality and faith. When I clean a stone, I think about who they were," Anita reflects. "What did they believe? What kind of life did they live?"

How Others Can Help

Anita welcomes anyone who feels called to join. It takes about an hour to clean a stone, and all supplies are provided through the DAR. No experience is needed—just a willing heart and a love for history. As Anita says, "The more hands, the more stories we can bring back to life."


Did you know that our church receives food from the 'Scouting for Food' Campaign to help fill our Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter food baskets?

Who Is A Member?

- Does regular service, attendance, and pledging define membership?
- What distinguishes a member from a non-member or associate member?
- After two years of not participating in any of these areas, should a person be considered inactive?

This conversation will help us clarify expectations and ensure our bylaws reflect both grace and accountability. We want every person to feel welcome—and every member to be accounted for and understood.

Let's come together in faith and fellowship to shape a definition of membership that reflects who we are and how we serve.



- Candies (e.g., fudge, pralines, popcorn balls) and other homemade edibles are welcome.
- <u>Try to avoid:</u> large, fancy cakes; large loaves of nut breads (smaller ones sell better); items that must be refrigerated (e.g., custard pies or fillings); and most pies in general, since we are taking pre-orders for pies to be picked up that day.




